Family Matters : Making the Most of Screen Use

<u>Tips for Grown-Ups:</u> Just as it's important to have balanced meals of food, we can think about having healthy, balanced MEALS of tech as well.

Model: Set a good example. Your kids will learn from watching your actions.

Engage: Have conversations about what they watch or play. Ask questions to make connections to their lives. **Adjust:** Not all screen time is the same. Choose age-appropriate,educational content.

Limit: Set healthy rules and expectations for your home.

Support: Support each other. Be patient, even on dayswhen rules go out the door!

Tips for Kids:

- 1. Pause for people. If someone speaks to you or needs your attention, pause the show or game.
- 2. Ask first. Ask your grown-up before watching a newshow or playing a new game.
- 3. Pause, breathe, finish up! When it's time to stop, take a deep breath and put device away.

Questions for Before, During, and After: Use these questions to talk with kids about books, movies, TV shows, podcasts, games, and more! You'll help them build important skills like remembering, emotional awareness, and critical thinking. Why do you want to watch, play, read, or listen to this? What do you think will happen? Does it remind you of anything? How does it make you feel? Which character would you like to be friends with? Why? Did you like it? Why or why not? What would you like to learn more about?

EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROCEDURES: FIRE DRILLS, TORNADO DRILLS, LOCKDOWN DRILLS

We began the school year reviewing and practicing our fire drill and school evacuations, and will review bus safety this month. We have drills to ensure that we know what to do in the case of a real event.

Lock Down Drills: In preparation for a situation that would be considered a threat to the school and its occupants, one of the responses of the school would be to lockdown the school. Why is it important to practice a lockdown drill? Practicing a lockdown drill is a way to be ready in keeping our school community safe and out of harm's way in the event of a situation that puts our school at-risk.

We practice for fire drill and lockdown procedures. Teachers prepare their students by outlining the procedures and ensuring that they understand the purpose of the drills. Students have a classroom based drill prior to school wide drills. We are not trying to alarm our students, simply prepare them and help them know we have a plan to keep them safe. Teachers stay with their students as they are instructed to shelter in place in their classroom away from windows and doors and to remain quiet. Parents/guardians are encouraged to discuss this at home well and if there are any emotional issues or past experiences that would make participation in a drill traumatic for your child, please contact the school so we can help connect further with your child to feel safe.




