PROGRESS CONVERSATION PARENT/TEACHER MEETINGS - Nov. 23

We will be hosting in-person meetings and are looking forward to connecting with you! This term we would like to meet with <u>all</u> parents/guardians. Our upcoming Progress Conversations between parents/guardians and teachers will take place on November 23rd between 4 and 8 p.m., *prior* to the sharing of the report card document on Parent Portal on Friday, November 24th. This time is set to take place in advance of reports, and parents and teachers may focus on the following:

- your child's learning experiences
- skills and evidence of learning observed in academics
- observations of social skills
- a conversation to include more than the summative marks on the report card- a time to ask questions on the progress of the whole child
- ensuring parents/guardians are informed before the marks or comments on report card are shared- without surprises on the reports
- strengthening the school and home team to support continued progress of your child in school!

BOOK YOUR TIME ON PARENT PORTAL: We will be giving parents/guardians the opportunity to book an **in-person** meeting with their child's teachers. Remember:

Being invited to a progress conversation is time dedicated for the family and school to connect! Teachers try to meet with all parents. You and the teacher both want the very best for your child. You can help your child by working together as a team. Your support matters!

Parent-Teacher Progress Conversation Checklist:

Before the conversation:

Ask your child how she/he feels about school.

Ask your child if there is anything that he/she wants you to talk about with his teacher.

Ask your child if there is anything that he/she wants you to talk about with his teacher.

Tell your child that you and the teacher are meeting to work together to help him/her.

Make a list of topics that you want to talk about with the teacher.

Prepare a list of questions such as:

1. What are my child's strengths? What are some areas that are challenges?
2. Does my child hand work in on time? Does my child start his/her work on their own?
3. Does my child participate in class?

4. Does my child seem happy at school?

5. What can I do at home to help?

During the conversation:

It is good to be on time and end on time as other parents are likely scheduled before and after. Relax, be yourself, and be comfortable and calm

Ask most important questions and view your child's work samples

Ask about your child's progress and any programming that is in place for them Ask for explanations of anything you don't understand

Ask your child's teacher for ways that you can help your child at home.

Thank the teacher.

After the conversation:

Talk about the conversation that you had with the teacher(s) with your child. Talk about the positive points, and be direct about ways to problem solve

Tell your child about any plans you and the teacher discussed.




