PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

It is really hard to believe that we are beginning our fourth month of school already! I enjoy spending time with students, visiting classrooms, and observing the learning that is taking place each day! The weather has been great for students to play outside- but I know they would love to see more snow for the infamous snow hill- I guess we will wait to see what mother nature has in store!

Staff celebrate student progress and we appreciate the way we can work together with families to ensure we all do our part to support learning. We are thankful that parents/guardians connected with our staff during term one and at our recent progress conversations. We always welcome discussion of how home and school can continue to be a team in support of your child(ren)- so please feel comfortable to connect with us! The following are just a few friendly reminders:

<u>Walking To and From School</u>: Student arrival begins at 8:50 am. We are so thankful to our crossing guards who are reliable and safely help students cross the highway in the morning and in the afternoon. Please have your child cross with the crossing guards. Patrols are stationed at the cross walk from 8:50-9:00 and from 3:45-3:55.

<u>Driver Safety by School Ground</u>: The bus loop is <u>not</u> to be used for pickup or drop offs. Please park in designated areas when picking up or dropping off your children. Please stop for patrols and adhere to the 30 km signs.

Student Safety by School Ground: Go over safety precautions with your child so they know which side of the road to walk/ or bike and that they are safe around traffic, or to use the designated paths. We expect town students that are walking home from school to safely walk <u>directly</u> to their destination. Please have your child check in with parent/guardian prior to playing outside or with friends at the end of the school day, as we have had some phone calls concerning that a child is taking too long to get home.

<u>Dismissal Arrangements</u>: Providing ample notice to the school if there are plans that are different than the normal dismissal arrangements is best and helps buses to leave on time. Please call to the office or email to both <u>bothwell@hsd.ca</u> and to your child's homeroom teacher.

Music classes are involved in many practices and preparations for the upcoming concert, "Sights and Sounds of the Season." All families and community members are invited to join and please see newsletter section for details of times and locations. In the past, we have traditionally included a Christian reference within our concert and this year we are having a secular concert. There are varying perspectives in our community and feedback from Bothwell School families is important. We want to be an inclusive and caring community with respect for all. I plan to share a survey to families following the concert to gather feedback for the future. On behalf of the staff at Bothwell School, I wish our students and their families a peaceful Christmas filled with love and happiness!

BRRR... IT'S GETTING COLDER

Winter weather is here! It is important that students dress warmly for the cold weather.



WARM BOOTS, MITTENS, HATS, SKI PANTS AND PARKAS can be the difference between students enjoying recess or enduring it.

*Scarves VS Neck Warmers—While both serve the same purpose, scarves can get caught on swings, tree branches or the play structure, **neck warmers** are preferred for play during recess.

*Shoes VS Boots—It is difficult to be active building snow forts at recess when students' shoes are filling with snow. All students are expected to be outside for AM, noon hour and PM recesses, so **winter boots** are the best! Wearing a warm pair of socks helps too! Students sometimes pack an extra dry pair!

We want our students to be comfortable at recess and not at risk of getting frostbite. If funds are a little tight, please let us know and we will be sure to help where we can! (call Mrs. Unger the secretary)

<u>Bus Students and Gr. 7/8 Human Ecology/Tech. Ed. Students</u>— Although it is rare, buses do break down in cold weather. It is important that students riding the bus have outdoor jackets along with them.

<u>School Closure</u>— In HSD when schools are closed and buses are cancelled, the announcement is made via a phone message sent to all HSD families (unless you have requested that your name be removed from the call list). 
