OUTDOOR RECESS

Our divisional policy is for our students to go outside for recesses. We do have students stay in doors when it -30 or colder (or with windchill) and shortened recess times between -25 to -29C. If you feel they are well enough to attend school, they are to go outside for some fresh air and a have a break in their day with friends.

Please know that during recess time, any student that begins to feel unwell may talk with a supervisor and our staff will work together to ensure students are taken care of and helped– we care about your children!

The reason we have this policy is because fresh air and play is a good thing throughout the day and we do not have regularly scheduled indoor supervision available to students.

GRADE 8 FAREWELL INFORMATION

The grade 8 students will be planning their in-school farewell celebration with Mrs. Muntain. As part of the year end traditions, students will work on designing a ceiling tile that will be displayed in their honour and enjoying a



collection of pictures in a powerpoint to view (a copy of the Google Slide can be shared with them if requested). We are so proud of the students and will enjoy helping them celebrate their accomplishments at Bothwell School.

Parents/families may choose to plan their own after school events if they so wish to do so.

GRADE 5 AND 7 PHYSICAL & HEALTH EDUCATION: HEALTHY LIFESTYLE PRACTICES

The Manitoba Physical Education and Health Curriculum encourages physically active and healthy lifestyles. Grade 5 and Grade 7 students will have learning activities that include age-appropriate instruction on: Movement, Fitness, Safety, Personal and Social Management, and Healthy Lifestyle Practices. Human growth development, reproductive health, and changes associated with puberty are a part of the provincial Health curriculum. They are approached with extra consideration and planning. Parents of students in Grade 5 and 7 will soon be sent an information letter with more details as these classes with a specific focus will take place in spring.

PARENT VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

All parents who wish to volunteer to go on field trips will be required to have up to date volunteer checks completed. If your checks are not up to date, you will need to complete the appropriate paperwork and process prior to volunteering. This process may take up to a few months. Volunteer applicants are required to pick up and complete a package which may include all or some of the following:

-General Application Form

-Police Information/Vulnerable Sector Check

-Criminal Record Check

-Pledge of Confidentiality




